It's been such an exciting time since school started in September and we're all "settled in" now, making friends and bonding with each other as a class family.

In addition to the social/emotional importance of this year (sharing, turn-taking, how to be kind and considerate, using our manners, etc) we have introduced letters A through K, learned our colors, and now have added numbers and shapes to our weekly exploration.
